Scholarships

WVU awards academic scholarships to incoming students. **To receive priority consideration**, please complete the admissions process to WVU by February 1. This includes submitting your completed Undergraduate Admissions Application along with your high school transcript and your ACT/SAT scores. If funding is available, students applying after the priority deadline date may receive scholarship consideration.

- •The Davis College of Agriculture, Forestry, and Consumer Sciences, the College of Business and Economics, the College of Engineering and Mineral Resources, the Eberly College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Human Resources and Education, the Perley Isaac Reed School of Journalism, the School of Nursing, and the School of Physical Education also offer scholarships and awards for incoming freshmen. If you have listed a major on the WVU Admissions Application that is in one of these areas, the WVU Scholars Office will forward your admissions information to that department so that you may be considered for their awards. In addition, other departments also offer scholarships for incoming freshmen. While the Scholars Office will make every effort to forward your application to those locations, you are encouraged to contact those departments directly to obtain more information about applying for their scholarships.
- Grade point average (GPA) is based on information received from a student's high school transcript and is calculated using the cumulative GPA for grades 9, 10, and 11.
- Meeting the minimum criteria does not guarantee that a student will receive the listed scholarship.
- Please note: If a student is eligible for more than one scholarship from the WVU Scholars Program, the student will be awarded the scholarship with the highest dollar value. To retain scholarships for subsequent years, all scholars (except Achievement Awardees and Regional Campus Scholars) are required to maintain specific cumulative grade point averages and to complete a minimum number of credits.

Financial Aid:

To be considered for any type of financial assistance including Federal Pell Grants, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants, Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Work-Study, William D. Ford Federal Direct Student Loans, and West Virginia Higher Educational Grants, applicants must file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is available in December from your counselor or WVU's Financial Aid Office. Please complete and mail the FAFSA after January 1 to the federal processing agency designated in your instructions. Apply early; March 1 is the deadline for maximum consideration. We recommend sending the completed FAFSA by February 15.
