



Application for Undergraduate Admission

Apply Early

Your application is very important to us, and for that reason we ask you to mail it as early as possible. Once we have received your application, you will hear from us concerning your admission decision and receive important WVU information every few weeks. College Freshmen

- Apply early — preferably by May 1 for the Fall Semester. Be sure to complete all the information on the application, and include the nonrefundable application fee (\$40.00 out-of-state; \$25.00 in-state).
- Send official transcripts of your previous schoolwork to WVU. You can send these with your application or have your high school send them separately. Also send official transcripts of any college work you have completed.
- Make sure your immunization record is on your high school transcript or have it sent directly to us. You should submit this record before you enroll.
- Students who have graduated within the last five years or whose expected graduation date was within the past five years must submit ACT or SAT scores. When you register for the ACT or SAT, arrange for them to report your scores to WVU (ACT 4540 and SAT 5904). If you've already taken the ACT or SAT but didn't specify that WVU receive your scores, write ACT or SAT and request this. It is best to take the ACT or SAT as early as possible.
- GED scores may be used for admission consideration. You need to submit a score of 45 or above for consideration.
- If you're worried that events beyond your control could affect your chances for admission, write a note of explanation and include it with your application. WVU has a committee that considers special circumstances.

Transfer Students

- If you have attended another college or university after graduating from high school, you are considered a transfer student. If you took college classes while in high school or the summer after your senior year of high school, you are considered a freshman.
- As a transfer student, please complete all the information on the application and forward your official transcripts from all previously attended institutions, along with the nonrefundable application fee. Transcripts issued directly to you or facsimile (fax) transcripts are not considered official. If you have attempted fewer than 29 college credits when you apply, please submit high school transcripts and ACT or SAT scores. Please include catalog pages describing college courses completed.
- Students transferring from WVU regional campuses do not need to pay the application fee or include catalog pages describing courses.
- Transfer students must have an overall grade point average of 2.0. Some majors require a higher GPA and completion of certain academic

requirements. If possible, apply for admission a full semester before your admissions deadline but no later than August 1 for the Fall Semester or December 1 for the Spring Semester.

Other Types of Undergraduates

- ACCESS Students (formerly known as High School Specials) are students who have completed their junior year with at least a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale and wish to take specific college classes. Please visit www.wvu.edu/~exlearn/ACCESS/ for more information or to download an application. ACCESS students do not have to complete this Undergraduate Admission Application, only the ACCESS application.
- Early Admission is granted for high school students who have completed their junior year with at least a 3.5 GPA, 26 on the ACT or 1170 on the SAT, and completed all high school graduation requirements except senior English. Your high school transcript and letters from your parent or guardian and the principal or counselor supporting your application and certifying you will graduate from high school must be submitted. An interview is also required before admission is granted.
- Nondegree students are in one of the following categories:
 - 1) applicants who do not plan on working toward a degree immediately;
 - 2) applicants who have been out of high school for more than five years, but do not meet current requirements; or
 - 3) applicants seeking additional undergraduate credits or seeking prerequisites for a degree program.

Please submit high school transcripts and any official transcripts from previous colleges or universities.

These courses cannot be applied toward a graduate degree.

- Readmission is for students who leave WVU for at least one semester. In order to be readmitted, you must be eligible to return. Eligibility is based on your GPA at WVU and at other institutions attended. Please send official transcripts from any institution attended since leaving WVU. Note: Students who have been suspended must petition the dean of the school or college you wish to be admitted to for permission to be reinstated before eligibility for readmission can be determined.
- Second Degrees are students who wish to complete a second undergraduate degree. Please submit official transcripts from all colleges and universities previously attended.
- Visiting Students are students who wish to transfer WVU credit back to their home institution. Admission may be granted by completion of this application and submission of transcript or an official statement indicating a 2.0 GPA from the last college attended.

Scholarships

WVU awards academic scholarships to incoming students. **To receive priority consideration**, please complete the admissions process to WVU by February 1. This includes submitting your completed Undergraduate Admissions Application along with your high school transcript and your ACT/SAT scores. If funding is available, students applying after the priority deadline date may receive scholarship consideration.

- The Davis College of Agriculture, Forestry, and Consumer Sciences, the College of Business and Economics, the College of Engineering and Mineral Resources, the Eberly College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Human Resources and Education, the Perley Isaac Reed School of Journalism, the School of Nursing, and the School of Physical Education also offer scholarships and awards for incoming freshmen. If you have listed a major on the WVU Admissions Application that is in one of these areas, the WVU Scholars Office will forward your admissions information to that department so that you may be considered for their awards. In addition, other departments also offer scholarships for incoming freshmen. While the Scholars Office will make every effort to forward your application to those locations, you are encouraged to contact those departments directly to obtain more information about applying for their scholarships.

- Grade point average (GPA) is based on information received from a student's high school transcript and is calculated using the cumulative GPA for grades 9, 10, and 11.

- Meeting the minimum criteria does not guarantee that a student will receive the listed scholarship.

- Please note:* If a student is eligible for more than one scholarship from the WVU Scholars Program, the student will be awarded the scholarship with the highest dollar value. To retain scholarships for subsequent years, all scholars (except Achievement Awardees and Regional Campus Scholars) are required to maintain specific cumulative grade point averages and to complete a minimum number of credits.

Financial Aid:

To be considered for any type of financial assistance including Federal Pell Grants, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants, Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Work-Study, William D. Ford Federal Direct Student Loans, and West Virginia Higher Educational Grants, applicants must file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is available in December from your counselor or WVU's Financial Aid Office. Please complete and mail the FAFSA after January 1 to the federal processing agency designated in your instructions. Apply early; **March 1 is the deadline for maximum consideration. We recommend sending the completed FAFSA by February 15.**
